IT's Security Tips of the Week

ITS Security Tip of the Week - Get Smart! ...About Protecting Your Smart Phone and Other Mobile Devices

More and more of us are now using smart phones and other mobile devices as integral tools in the CHI work environment. It's important to know that along with the increased convenience offered by smart phones and other portable devices, we also face increased exposure and more potential liabilities.

According to a sobering study recently conducted by Carnegie Mellon University:

- 40% of organizations have had mobile devices lost or stolen
- 50% of those lost or stolen devices contained business critical data and
- More than one third of mobile device losses have a financial impact on the user's organization

The study also found that about 50% of mobile device users keep passwords, PINs or credit card details on their mobile devices, and one in three keep sensitive work-related information on their smart phones.

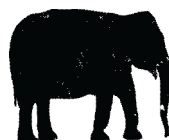
Always keep in mind that as a member of the CHI workforce, you are a *steward of the information* with which you have been entrusted and *you are responsible for keeping that information secure*.

The Mobile Computing section of the [Acceptable Use of CHI IT Assets Policy](#) is very clear about this:

The User must ensure that the information residing on these devices is secured from unauthorized access, use and/ or disclosure. The User is required to take the following precautions when using mobile devices:

- CHI Confidential Information may not be stored on mobile computing devices unless the device has adequate security protection. If there is business need for mobile storage of CHI Confidential Information,
- the User must have a CHI approved secure storage solution for the mobile computing device.
- All CHI-owned mobile devices must be encrypted.
- Mobile storage devices such as flash drives and external hard drives should not be used. If required, contact ITS Help Desk for a secure technical solution.
- Mobile storage devices must not be left unattended.

Mobile storage devices must have password protection enabled at all times.
